Mr. Sutter:

Your letter of July 16, 2002, (received August 2, 2002) is an outrageous insult to every honest and literate American!

If you did not read the filing before returning it, you are negligent.

If you did read it, you are either incompetent or as corrupt as those whose corruption brings me to the United States Supreme Court.

The proof:

- The highest "United States Court of Appeals" and "the highest state court," the Supreme Court of the State of Ohio, are both clearly cited as parties to the action in the "Statement of the Case." As they are parties to the action, your demand is incredibly inappropriate.
- The Constitution of the United States of America is apparently a foreign document to you. Article III perhaps exceeded you ability to comprehend, for it is almost a complete page in length. Thus, I shall cite just a small portion in the hopes of remaining within your capabilities. In Section 2. of Article III, "Clause 2: In all Cases affecting Ambassadors, other Public Ministers and Consuls, and those in which a state shall be Party, the Supreme Court shall have **original jurisdiction.**" To assist you, I did increase the size and emphasis on the words "original jurisdiction." This was cited in paragraph 2. of the "Questions Presented."
- This may come as shocking news to you, but the Constitution of the United States of America takes precedence over the United States Code. 28 USC 1254 and 1257 are thus without effect in this matter.

Your citations are just another artifice employed to avoid the true responsibilities of your office. Your behavior places you among those who are a part of the corruption that has brought me to this Court.

If you do not like the sarcastic tone of this letter, then **DO YOUR JOB: Honor the Constitution.**

That is all I have asked of any in this case. All have refused: whether through fear or evil is not relevant. Nor is it relevant in your refusal to take this unusual and valid filing, which directly relates to the foundations of our society that so handsomely rewards you.

How tragic that while men and women of our Armed Forces are living in tents and losing life and limb for the Constitution, you are unable to summon the patriotism and courage to saunter down an air conditioned hall and personally hand this to the Justice who most considers the Constitution and the "people" it serves.

The petition is herewith returned for filing.
